Juniors Update - Brad Loder

We hope that you are all as excited for the new season as we are! For those of you who are new to Junior rugby then this year is a big transition with larger fields, longer games, bigger squads and graded teams. Grading is a selection process which gives the players a fair and full opportunity to display their ability for selection and to be matched to the most appropriate grade to represent the Club.

Selection is a difficult and subjective process, with many contributing factors, interests and emotions involved for selectors, parents and players. It is the Clubs intention to ensure the selection process is clear, widely understood, fair, transparent and unbiased. The goal is that selection disputes will be minimised, and results will be optimised. Based on my experience, and external feedback, WRC has one of the most robust selection processes of all Junior rugby clubs. We will be providing more information about the process as we get nearer, but if you have any question in the interim, please contact me.

The selection process takes place over three stages:

Internal Trials: 9th & 16th March. Each age group is split into teams and play a series of shortened games against each other. This is to help the selectors make their initial decisions on provisional teams and positions. This takes place at Cliff Oval.

External Trials: 23rd & 30th March. The provisional teams play a series of shortened games against one or two other clubs. The idea is to see how the team and players perform against opposition in more match like conditions and to incorporate any feedback from the selectors from internal trials. These games will take place at Cliff Oval, or some age groups may have to travel to other grounds.

SJRU Grading: 6th & 13th April. Upon completion of the internal and external trials the selection process has been completed and teams selected. These grading days and games are organised by SJRU to help determine which division each team should be placed in with the objective that all teams within a division are competitive and there isn't a dominate team/s. These games take place at different venues across Sydney.

Trials can be a stressful time, my advice is to trust the process. Our selectors do a wonderful job, they are only human and they may make a small number of decisions not everyone will agree with but I am confident the process is fair and equitable.

U16s

We understand there has been a lot of talk around the formation of the team this year and the discussion around forming district-based teams via the allowance by SJRU to do so. The most important thing you can do, is to register with Wahroonga Rugby Club, this allows us to understand numbers and then work within our Gordon village and outside to have the best possible outcome for the players, there will be no Gordon based team in 2025. We are working hard on some high-level coaches to be involved in 2025 and we have your kid's development and enjoyment at the heart of it. At this stage we will be entering team in the SJRU U16 competition. We sincerely hope that you wish to continue to play for Wahroonga, this is your club, let's finish on a high





Another difference with Juniors is the Volunteer Roles Required:

Age Coordinator (AC): work closely with the VP Juniors to ensure each age group is operating smoothly. They also help appoint managers for each team and ensure they have all the relevant information

Ground Marshall (GM): the GM is a broad role but essentially it is to make sure the game/s run smoothly, including ground set up (home team), player welfare, and that everyone (coaches, manager, players and parents) conducts themselves with the appropriate behaviour, especially towards the match officials. To qualify as a GM you need to do a short online course.

Assistant Referees (AR): An AR helps the referee ensure that the game is fair and runs smoothly. They signal incidents of foul play, indicate where the lineout throw-ins should be placed, and adjudicate goal kicks and balls that go into touch. Course information to be sent out via AC's.

Manager: The manager is the primary point of contact for each team and are responsible for communicating to the team about games, training, updating TeamSnap and managing the kit. Foster team spirit and morale by encouraging participation in team activities and club-run events. Also, game day responsibilities such as entering players and scoring in Rugby Explorer



Coaching Update - Dion Bowen

Preseason preparations – thank you very much to the coaches, parents and players that turned up to make our Preseason Come & Try event on 7th February a success. The minis and juniors that turned up all had a great introduction to the season and it was pleasing to see our club making new players and families feel welcome!

Coaching appointments – there have been several questions regarding coaches for 2025, as with every year, and as per our policy, coaches will not be appointed until after the trials process is complete. All coaches assisting with preseason do so in a 'caretaker' mode, working with the entire age group.





Equipment – We have undertaken an audit of our training equipment finding a need to purchase new gear for the 2025 season. We have refreshed our stock of red and yellow cones which are targeted at setting up the fields for Minis Game Day. We've also purchased WRC Tigers Customised Hit Shields which we look forward to trialling during March. In 2025 we will be providing teams with WRC Tigers branded balls, kindly sponsored by SIXT. They are due to arrive in April due to production timelines, so watch this space.

Coaching accreditations - Rugby AU has released a new coaching pathway in 2025 which has changed the names and structure of previous courses. In addition to a Working with Children Check, all coaches are required to hold their SMART Rugby accreditation and given the updated structure we recommend that you do the refresher course which will cover you and extend by 12 months.

As always, the club expects all Juniors Coaches to be accredited to Level 1, which is now known as "Junior Coach" accreditation. Our Club Coach is planning for WRC to host a course in 2025.

Girls Update - Justine Brindley

The 2025 season for girls will include teams playing the Sera Naiqama XV a side competition! This is the first time we have had access to a full XV competition run on a home and away basis for the girls and this is super exciting! The competition includes the following age groups of u12, u14, u16 and u18. It runs the same time as the boys/mixed competition commencing with:

- Trial Galas 6th & 13th April
- Round One 4th May
- Grand Finals 31st August

Whilst we are super excited to have this offering to run teams in a competition of this size, we will need squads of around 20 to be competitive. We are encouraging girls to join the club – please register as soon as possible to show interest!

As a club we will need to monitor our numbers. We are also exploring other options e.g. joint ventures to ensure we can get our girls in a team to play club rugby! The SJRU have also made a new rule that girls who are u13 and above can no longer play in a mixed team with dispensation and they must play in a girl's only team. This is unfortunate as we have several girls who have followed this pathway. If you fall into this category, please contact vp_girls@wahroongarugby.com.au for a discussion on options.

There is also only one 7s competition available in 2025 for club rugby girls and this is late October/November, so if you want to play before then jump into the cool technical XVs designed for all types of players!

We look forward to a great 2025 season! Please tell your school mates and friends an exciting season of XV awaits!!






Registration 2025


